Colleagues,

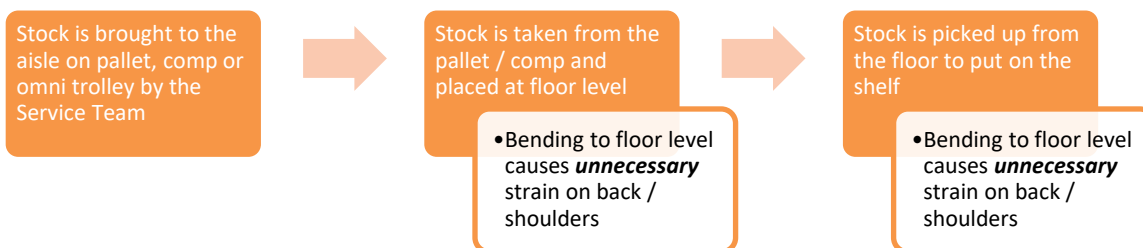
Following undertaking safety inspections within ASDA Stores and speaking with our GMB members the process of spotting stock continues and is causing injury to our members.

Spotting is the bad practice of taking stock from cages or pallets and placing them on the floor in front of the shelves or at the end of aisles where they are to be re-worked.

**ASDA POLICY STATES DAY OR NIGHT COLLEAGUES MUST NEVER SPOT PRODUCTS.**

Furthermore, spotting takes **LONGER**, it puts more strain onto the colleague due to having to pick up all stock from the floor level and causes trip hazards for colleagues and customers.
